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Patty Brisben Foundation Grants \$250K to Women's Health Initiatives

CINCINNATI (August 26, 2016) – The Patty Brisben Foundation for Women's Sexual Health (PBF), a non-profit organization founded by Pure Romance Founder and Chairwoman Patty Brisben, is a national leader in bringing focus to concerns of women across the country connected to their sexual health and well-being. During this year's AASECT (American Association of Sexuality Educators, Counselors and Therapists) Conference in June, Patty was recognized for her work as a trailblazer in the field by colleagues from The Center for Sexual Health Promotion at Indiana University, and thanked for allowing organizations like theirs and others to exist.

The 2016 grant funded projects range from counseling programs to research studies within the Foundation's four key focus areas:

- Impact of Perimenopause and Menopause on Sexual Health
- Intimacy Related Sexual Dysfunction After Cancer Treatments
- Vulvovaginal Pain Disorders
- Libido and Desire

2016 Grant Recipient Project Summaries

- **Cancer Family Care Cincinnati, OH:** Ongoing support of local counseling initiative for women coping with cancer and its' impact on their sexual health
- University of Kentucky Research Foundation Lexington, KY: Research to examine the impact that motherhood has on women's sexual desire, and possible risk or protective factors for sexual functioning among women and their romantic partners
- Massachusetts General Hospital Boston, MA: Support to establish a Radiation Oncology Sexual Health Survivorship Clinic for patients treated with pelvic radiation
- Oregon Health & Science University Portland, OR: Research study on estrogen responsiveness applied to the vestibule area vs. vaginally, and the effectiveness of estrogen cream in treating postmenopausal penetrative pain
- **Topsy Foundation Dover, DE/Mpumalanga, South Africa:** Expansion of women's sexual health services and education offered to women in South Africa through home based visits, and increased community based awareness
- Wright State University Dayton, OH: Impact of Vitamin D treatment in women with polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), with and without hormonal birth control, and evaluation of treatment outcomes related to the sexual health status of women

As a celebration of the Foundation's success and a fundraising effort for continued strides in women's sexual health research and resources, PBF will hold the **11th Annual Patty Brisben Foundation Gala** on Saturday, October 8 at Greenacres Arts Center in Indian Hill.
